

Spotlight: Business Career and Networking Event

This month, the Business Department and SCLP hosted the first Career and Networking Event of the semester. Students came dressed to impress and ready to network! The event began with a lively presentation from panelists representing a variety of fields in business, including digital marketing, auditing, public accounting, cybersecurity, and small business ownership.



Students offered questions like:

"How did you find the transition phase from the classroom to the workplace?" "How much of your classroom experience have you used in the real world?" "Does anyone have plans to achieve new degrees/certifications to support lifelong learning?"

Students also asked targeted questions to the panelists:

"How long did it take you to start a small business?" "Do you find it difficult to adapt to changes in social media in the workplace?" "Do you feel your career in the air force prepared you for the field of cybersecurity?"



Following the panel discussion, students broke into small groups and met with each panelist for career-related conversation. They were then challenged by the panelists to answer some common interview questions such as: "Talk about an accomplishment you are especially proud of," and "Give me an example of an important goal you set and how you took steps to achieve that goal."

The panelists then provided feedback to help students shine during the interview process. Student Sara Baruffaldi reported that she learned "how to speak more in depth in interviews" to show her strengths and accomplishments. When speaking with BPU alumnae and panelist Sam Bujak, student Kendale Clarke learned the strategy to "take a brief pause to gather your thoughts and everything will flow naturally." Student Samantha Colon also learned the importance of "feeling confident and taking notes" during the interview process. Following these lively table discussions, the event concluded with the Personal Shopper Raffle won by Thuy Truong!

When senior Marketing major Nataly Monsalve was contacted by Career Coach Sally Schirmer-Smith with an internship opportunity, Nataly knew it was the perfect fit for her. The position available was at Rachel's Table, a nonprofit whose mission is to alleviate hunger and reduce food waste in Western MA. Nataly submitted her resume and cover letter, and was contacted for an interview with the Director and Assistant Director of the program. At the interview, she spoke of her long-term goals, explained why she wanted to work for a non-profit, and described what she could offer the program. She was accepted immediately and began her internship in mid-September. She is the first BPU student to intern at this sitė! In her role, she is primarily responsible for spearheading the "Valley Gives" fundraiser that will run in October, creating and uploading videos online to raise awareness for the cause, and expanding the program's presence on social media.



She will also have the opportunity to accompany the staff on a collection trip from grocery stores and restaurants to deliver food to different agencies and soup kitchens in the area. Nataly looks forward to working with this non-profit and gaining the skills needed for her next endeavor- joining the Peace Corps!

On October 1st, BPU students took a seat at the table with Provost and Vice President of Academic Affairs, Dr. Melissa Morriss-Olson. Joining them was Susan Alston, a member of the Professional Image Task Force and a graduate of Bay Path's Master's Program in Nonprofit Management and Philanthropy. Students had the rare opportunity to share an intimate meal with these women engaged in leading and learning. The luncheon simulated a professional American business luncheon. Students engaged in an open dialogue with Dr. Morriss-Olson, Susan Alston, and SCLP staff members regarding etiquette questions relating to a formal, business-driven dining experience. Students learned how to appropriately tackle difficult menu choices with grace, how to address food that is unappealing, and which topics of conversation are and are not best suited to the occasion.

In addition, Dr. Morriss-Olson delivered an engaging keynote sharing her personal story and highlighting important life lessons. She encouraged the students to claim who they are and to go with confidence into a world that needs them. She reminded the students that life is not a straight line, but instead a web we build to make sense of our experiences. Dr. Morris-Olson urged students to respond to every opportunity that presents itself and to get comfortable with being uncomfortable, as this will push them to succeed.





Career Celebration Spotlight: Lindsay Young

Following her graduation from the BPU Psychology program in 2013, Lindsay Young met a group of professionals while waitressing at a local restaurant. They tried to convince her to apply for a position with Barton Associates, a temporary staffing and recruiting agency.

While she appreciated the tip, she had already accepted a position at Symetra, a financial services company which happens to be in the same building as Barton Associates She had been working with Symetra for about a year when she ran into one of her former customers from the restaurant. He convinced her to apply to Barton Associates online, and she was immediately contacted for a brief phone interview. She was contacted again for a second, in-person interview which lasted about two hours! She learned about the different departments of the company and the role of account managers and recruiters. She was offered the position and is now the Associate Account Development Manager. Though the hours can be long and she spends most of her day on the phone with providers, she most enjoys working in a great environment with other entry-level professionals. While she is happy with her job at this point, Lindsay plans to pursue a psychology-related graduate degree to become a counselor and move to
